West Minster Woods Summer Camps – Registration is open for their two principle programs, Camp Heartwood and Camp Soulspring, lovingly referred to as the Heart and Soul of Westminster Woods, both are residential summer camps. These two programs comprise the majority of the summer calendar with each program offering multiple six-day sessions. We also provide three specialty programs: The Grove, our

<u>Ash Wednesday and Lent</u> – It feels like we just finished with Christmas and Epiphany, but Ash Wednesday and Lent are coming soon. Ash Wednesday is on Valentine's Day (Feb 14th), and Bruce is working on an evening service (time TBD). From then on, it is the Lent/Easter countdown; with Easter is early this year, **March 31**st.

<u>Lenten Taize</u> services will start **Tues, Feb 20**th; held **weekly through March 26**th. If you are looking for a way to experience the Lenten season with meaning and depth, you will find it in our Taize service. The sanctuary doors open at 6:30 pm and the service is from 6:45 - 7:30 pm.

<u>Annual Easter Egg Hunt</u> will be on **Palm Sunday, Mar 24**th immediately following worship. Toddlers, Pre-schoolers, and Kindergartners to Fifth Graders, are invited to search for colorful, filled eggs.

<u>Committee Minutes</u> – Our Clerk of Session, Deborah Crim, has posted committee minutes up on the bulletin board between the Sanctuary and the Social Hall. To keep informed, read what our committees have been discussing.

<u>Lost and Found</u> – Check out the lost and found, also known as, "the coat rack between the Sanctuary and Social Hall". There are many water bottles, along with other miscellaneous items. Items not re-moved will be donated locally.

<u>Per Capita: What is it?</u> – It's Stone Church's support of our denominational church structure: San Jose Presbytery (local), Synod of the Pacific (regional), and PC(USA) General Assembly (national). Each local Presbyterian Church supports this structure. Our church's commitment, based on 300 members, is \$12,450.

Paying your Per Capita portion (\$41.50 <u>per member</u>) is a <u>voluntary</u> commitment on your part, <u>not "Presbyterian dues."</u> Any of that church commitment that isn't paid by individuals has to be paid from church funds that could have gone to other useful purposes. Your payment represents your

willingness to be a participant in our shared mission to God's service with all the other members of all the other churches of the PCUSA denomination. When making your payment, note "Per Capita" on the donation.

The Banner on the front wall was created for Virginia Thibeaux and Anne Towler's (Stone members') Holy Union Celebration (8/30/2003) at First Presbyterian Church of San Anselmo; presided by the Rev Janie Spahr. This is appliquéd, quilted, and painted work of art is patterned after the liturgical artist HeQi's "Ruth and Naomi;" for which permission was given by the artist himself. It portrays the portion of Ruth 1:12-22 where Ruth and Naomi are clinging together (with the basket of bread nearby, signifying food for their journey or the bread made from gleaning in Boaz's fields). This was a joint



creation of Virginia Thibeaux and the Rev. Shelly Holle, who led a team of quilters in a mad, scramble to finish in time for the service. To view the original:
