### **The Second Lesson**

*Acts 8: 26-38 (N.T., p. 126)*

*Then an angel of the Lord said to Philip, 'Get up and go towards the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza.' (This is a wilderness road.) So he got up and went. Now there was an Ethiopian eunuch, a court official of the Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, in charge of her entire treasury. He had come to Jerusalem to worship and was returning home; seated in his chariot, he was reading the prophet Isaiah. Then the Spirit said to Philip, 'Go over to this chariot and join it.' So Philip ran up to it and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah. He asked, 'Do you understand what you are reading?' He replied, 'How can I, unless someone guides me?' And he invited Philip to get in and sit beside him. Now the passage of the scripture that he was reading was this:*

*'Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter, and like a lamb silent before its shearer, so he does not open his mouth. In his humiliation, justice was denied him. Who can describe his generation? For his life is taken away from the earth.'*

*The eunuch asked Philip, 'About whom, may I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?' Then Philip began to speak, and starting with this scripture, he proclaimed to him the good news about Jesus. As they were going along the road, they came to some water; and the eunuch said, 'Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?' He commanded the chariot to stop, and both of them, Philip and the eunuch, went down into the water, and Philip baptized him.*

**Welcome Guests and Visitors!** We hope you already feel at home among us here at Stone Church. The nearest **restroom** is located between the Sanctuary and the Social Hall; exit thru the double doors at the front of the Sanctuary (near the TV). Everyone is invited for **refreshments** and fellowship in the Social Hall and on the patio after worship. We welcome the sound of any little ones during worship, but if your baby (age 0-3) gets too wiggly for you, you may take them to the **Nursery**, located in the hallway between the Sanctuary & the Social Hall. It's open each Sunday for children ages 0-3 during worship.

**Sermon Theme Today** – Ethiopian Eunuch story; celebrating diversity.

**Flowers** today are in loving memory of Mercedes Martin, Wayne Martin's wife, whose memorial was held yesterday.

**Children's Choir Practice Today** - Children attend worship with their parents, and will leave with Peggy later for choir practice. In addition, there are some children's activity boxes in the Narthex to use while they are in the Sanctuary.

Children's Church School and Choir is changing to a biweekly format; and the children will remain with Amber for the full worship hour when there is Church School. On Communion Sundays, they will still participate in communion, but will return to Sunday school afterwards. *Bi-weekly Sunday school or choir practice schedule: April 28 (Choir), May 5, 12 & 19, June 2. During the summer, there will be no Church School or choir practice.*

**Adult Ed** (11am SA) – Kerrie Romanow, the Director of Environmental Services for the City of San José, leads the city to meet the climate goals of the Paris Accords through *Climate Smart San Jose* an ambitious, data driven climate plan to decrease San José's carbon emissions, conserve water, and improve the quality of life. Learn about recycling, changing to electric, building codes, *San Jose Clean Energy*, and more. This isn't a live presentation, but a video of her March 21<sup>st</sup> interview with Gloria Chun Hoo of the League of Women Voters. Any questions can be sent to Ms. Romanow's office; her contact info, plus other links to San Jose's programs will be handed out at the end of the presentation.
