Call to Confession

This letter was sent out earlier this week via email. Please note the invitation to all (in bold) to hear Bruce's report about his time here at Stone. This will take place in the Sanctuary.

Dear Stone Church,

Greetings all. I hope you are enjoying the beautiful weather that has been present these past few days.

I promise this IS the last email blast you will receive from me © but first, let me say how excited I am for you as you will welcome your new Interim Pastor, Fred Harrell, to the community on Easter Sunday. While I will

certainly miss being with you all that Sunday, I cannot think of a better way for Stone to usher in this new season than having it begin when the church boldly and blatantly celebrates the new life that Christ offers.

You will really appreciate Fred's leadership, and I can't wait to see how God's hopes unfold.

So yes, my time is coming to an end and, while I am helping to coordinate worship through Easter, the last time we can interact in person will be when I share some of my observations from the over four dozen interviews I had with so many of you.

I will present an initial report, interact a bit with Session, and then open it up to the rest of the community to respond.

Easter Sunday, We will welcome our new Transitional Pastor, the Rev. Fred Harrell. Session approved his contract Sunday, March 10, 2024.

Fred is a native of Central Florida and a graduate of the University of Florida and Reformed Theological Seminary.

In 1996, he founded <u>City Church San Francisco</u> and led it to a congregation of over 1800 congregants. During that time, the church spawned auxiliary ministries in Counseling, Education, and Social Transformation.

In 2006, Fred helped move the church to an egalitarian position, cutting ties with the Presbyterian Church in America, and realigning with the Reformed Church in America. Then, in 2015, he led City Church to an open and affirming position for

those in the LGBTQ community.

In 2023, Rev Harrell established "Cultivate," a ministry dedicated to promoting the well-being of pastors and fostering thriving churches.

On February 13th of this year, Fred transferred his ministerial credentials to the PCUSA. He is a minister in good standing with The Presbytery of San Francisco.

When queried about the source of his joy, Fred responds, "Anything that draws upon my 33 years of ordained ministry experience." He is determined to leverage those three decades of experience to benefit others in their ministry journey. Currently, Fred is pursuing certification as a Spiritual Director through the Art of Spiritual Direction program offered by San Francisco Theological Seminary. Fred will complete his certification in The Art of Transitional Ministry on March 21st of this year.

Fred and his wife, Terely (rhymes with the tire brand "Pirelli"), have been married since 1986 and have four adult children ranging from 33 to 26 years old.

Rev. Dr. Elizabeth (Libby) Boatwright; chaplain, pastor, author, and certified financial planner, who's currently a relief chaplain for Stanford Health Care, frequent guest preacher, lecturer, and podcast guest on end-of-life is-sues, based on her book, The Last Things We Talk About, a compilation of her 35 years counseling people on these issues.
