<u>On Summer Hiatus</u> - Adult Ed, the Choir, and Children's Church School will all return September 14<sup>th</sup>.

<u>Summer Psalm Series</u> - The Psalms are the ancient prayer book of God's people—raw, poetic, defiant, and tender. Across centuries, they have helped people express joy, grief, anger, trust, and awe.

This summer at Stone Church, we'll journey through nine powerful psalms that speak to our real lives: offering comfort, courage, honesty, and hope.

<u>Liturgical Season</u> - Our Liturgical Arts group is proud to share their latest creation----the green wall hanging on the front wall of the sanctuary. Almost entirely assembled from remnants of previous projects, look for familiar patterns, including those used for choir stoles and the Six Great Ends of the Church banners on the back wall. The two-sided green hangings on the side walls highlight Paul's letter to the Galatians (5:22-23). By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faith-fulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such a thing.

Colors can orient us to the season of the church year and help to engage the sense of sight in worship. White and gold symbolize days and seasons of joy and mark pivotal events in the life of Christ. Red symbolizes the work of the Holy Spirit. Purple designates a season of penitence and preparation, such as Lent. Green symbolizes new life for the rest of the church calendar also called "Ordinary Time" because the Sundays are assigned *ordinal* numbers: First Sunday, Second Sunday, and so on.

Currently we are in Ordinary Time which is celebrated in two segments: from the Monday following the Baptism of Our Lord up to Ash Wednesday; and from Pentecost Monday to the First Sunday of Advent. This makes it the largest season of the Liturgical Year (33 weeks)

<u>Our Monthly Taizé</u> is **this Tues July 1**<sup>st</sup> (1<sup>st</sup> Tuesday of the month). Taizé Prayer is evening prayer for all Christian faiths. It is a simple, meditative form of worship, calling us to dwell deeply on Christ's presence around and within us. Mantra songs (like "Jesus, Remember Me"), prayerful silence, and short readings guide the focus of the prayer in a candle-lit environment. Come explore this time of quiet, music, scripture, and prayer. Sanctuary doors open at 6:30 pm and the service is from 6:45 - 7:30 pm.

<u>Donate Food Next Sunday</u> – The First Sunday of the month, we collect and donate food for Sacred Heart Community Services. **Next week** we'll have our collection baskets in the Narthex to gather donated food/goods. Consider bringing one of these: pop-top cans and other packaged food items (no homemade food); gently used or new blankets and linens; hygiene items of unopened toothpaste, shampoo, deodorant, toothbrushes, etc.; diapers (both infant and adult); unopened infant formula; new socks, and new underwear for men, women and children; and gently used or new sleeping bags.
