The Second Lesson

John 21: 1-19 (N.T., p. 115)

After these things Jesus showed himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias; and he showed himself in this way. Gathered there together were Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of his disciples. Simon Peter said to them, 'I am going fishing.' They said to him, 'We will go with you.' They went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing.

Just after daybreak, Jesus stood on the beach; but the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, 'Children, you have no fish, have you?' They answered him, 'No.' He said to them, 'Cast the net to the right side of the boat, and you will find some.' So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in because there were so many fish. That disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, 'It is the Lord!' When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on some clothes, for he was naked, and jumped into the lake. But the other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they were not far from the land, only about a hundred yards off.

When they had gone ashore, they saw a charcoal fire there, with fish on it, and bread. Jesus said to them, 'Bring some of the fish that you have just caught.' So Simon Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish, a hundred and fifty-three of them; and though there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, 'Come and have breakfast.' Now none of the disciples dared to ask him, 'Who are you?' because they knew it was the Lord. Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish. This was now the third time that Jesus appeared to the disciples after he was raised from the dead.

When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, 'Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?' He said to him, 'Yes, Lord; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my lambs.' A second time he said to him, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' He said to him, 'Yes, Lord; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Tend my sheep.' He said to him the third time, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' Peter felt hurt because he said to him the third time, 'Do you love me?' And he said to him, 'Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my sheep. Very truly, I tell you, when you were younger, you used to fasten your own belt and to go wherever you wished. But when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will fasten a belt around you and take you where you do not wish to go.' (He said this to indicate the kind of death by which he would glorify God.) After this he said to him, 'Follow me.'

> During April, **the Presbyterian Women (PW)**, and friends are serving coffee & refreshments after worship. All are invited!

<u>Welcome Guests and Visitors!</u> We hope you already feel at home among us here at Stone Church. The nearest **restroom** is located between the Sanctuary and the Social Hall; exit thru the double doors at the front of the Sanctuary (near the TV). Everyone is invited for **refreshments** and fellowship in the Social Hall and on the patio after worship. We welcome the sound of any little ones during worship, but if your baby (age 0-3) gets too wiggly for you, you may take them to the **Nursery**, located in the hallway between the Sanctuary & the Social Hall. It's open each Sunday for children ages 0-3 during worship. All older children are invited to participate in the children's sermon time, usually followed by church school.

<u>Sermon Theme Today</u> – Jesus makes breakfast for the disciples on the side of lake; reinstatement of Peter.

<u>Children's Sunday School</u> – Today children will meet with Peggy Spool in the Fireside Room for choir practice.

Children's Sunday School will change to a biweekly format, with the children in Sunday School for the entire service. They will still participate in communion, but will return to Sunday School afterwards. **Biweekly Sunday School Schedule: Apr 21 & 28, May 5, 12 & 19, Jun 2.**

On alternate Sundays, when Sunday school in not in session, Peggy will lead the children in Choir practice. As always, there are children's activity boxes in the Narthex to use while in the Sanctuary.

Banner – Hanging on the front sanctuary wall is, *The Proclamation of the Gospel for the Salvation of Human-kind*, the first of the "Six Great Ends of the Church" (PC, USA), interpreted by our Liturgical Arts group. The cross of Christ (in multi-shades of blue, 2" squares), is our salvation, as proclaimed in the Scripture (the open book) which were inspired by the Holy Spirit (the dove). The red background is machine-quilted.

<u>Anointing ~ 2nd Sundays</u> – Today after worship, come up to the front of the Sanctuary (near the piano) for anointing from Rev. Dr. David McCreath; an opportunity for a moment of personal prayer and anointing. Anointing, an ancient practice that continues in todays churches, originally used to designate public leaders, such as kings, or used as part of a healing process for illnesses. At Stone Church, it is used as a symbol of God's grace, an act calling forth the Holy Spirit, a way of demonstrating the presence of God, of the desire of God that we find peace and comfort.

<u>Visit The Libraries Today!</u> - The adult library in Lincoln House is open during coffee hour today for the first time in several years. Library volunteers will open the library as often as possible, posting a sign in the Social Hall near the back door.

The back door to Lincoln House will be open when a volunteer is present. Access to the children's/YA library needs to be made through the church school rooms. Please visit; you are sure to be rewarded with some amazing finds!
