<u>Kick-Off Sunday!</u> - Sun, Sept 14th – The choir returns, as well as Church School, Adult Ed, and Youth Group!

<u>Adult Ed in 2 weeks</u> – Sun, Sept 14th Join Craig Edgerton, the author of *Permission to Walk in Peace*. This book is an anthology crafted by combat veterans, offering an artistic blend of poetry, essays, and stories that explore the intense

and personal aftermath of war. It's unique in that it provides a first-hand account of healing from military PTSD that no other book has ever offered. Through their raw and personal recounting of events, the veterans share how they have chosen to grow from their experience and not be victims of it. The goal is to offer a beacon of hope for anyone dealing with trauma.

<u>September's Taizé Service</u> is **this coming Tues**, **Sept 2**nd (1st Tuesday of every month). Please come explore this time of quiet, music, scripture, and prayer. Sanctuary doors open at 6:30pm, service starts at 6:45pm.

<u>Donate Food Next Sunday</u> – The First Sunday of the month, we collect and donate food for Sacred Heart Community Services. **Next week** we'll have our collection baskets in the Narthex to gather donated food/goods. Consider bringing one of these: pop-top cans and other packaged food items (no homemade food); gently used or new blankets and linens; hygiene items of unopened toothpaste, shampoo, deodorant, toothbrushes, etc.; diapers (both infant and adult); unopened infant formula; new socks, and new underwear for men, women and children; and gently used or new sleeping bags.
